It includes circumstances where the child is subjected to commercial sexual exploitation and sex trafficking by the child’s parent, guardian or custodian, or the parent, guardian or custodian’s failure to supervise the child.

² This is the dependency process in Kansas but overlaps with CHINS-type conduct (i.e., truancy, absent from home, commits a delinquent offense while under the age of 10). It includes a child who has been sexually abused which is defined to include “allowing, permitting or encouraging a child to engage in prostitution or to be photographed, filmed or depicted in pornographic material.”
