Dependent Child	 Authority for Initial Custody: Peace officer or child safety worker may take a child into custody to protect him or her from: Imminent risk of abuse or neglect Serious physical or emotional injury 	→ Where is child referred after initial custody? Immediate examination by a doctor or psychologist
	 Placement: Return home or place with relative Foster care Temporary custody, child may not be detained in a police station or lock up 	When and how does court assume jurisdiction? Any interested party may file a petition to commence proceedings
Incorrigible Child	 ➤ Authority for Initial Custody: Law enforcement may take custody if there is: - A court order or a warrant - Reasonable grounds to believe the child ran away or is incorrigible 	→ Where is child referred after initial custody? To the parent or the juvenile court
