SURVIVAL SEX TRAFFICKING WARNING SIGNS

Signs that an individual may be trafficked:

- Minors traveling without adult supervision
- Avoids eye contact; alone, unkempt, scared/ crying, disheveled appearance
- Dressed inappropriately for weather or age
- Offer to exchange sex for ride, meal, etc.
- Fearful or anxious behavior if bringing up law enforcement
- Withdrawn, submissive, tense, nervous and paranoid
- Does not know the person who is picking them up, (on the street, at bus or train station)
- Looks malnourished or exhausted
- Has few or no personal belongings, may not have control of money or ID.
- May display tattoos or branding, (may be the name of trafficker or reference to money)
- Claims just visiting, traveling with relative, inconsistent story, inability to provide address or information where staying.
- Sharing personal information online
- Interacting with significantly older people online

Things aren't always what they seem:

- Is the child in companionship with someone significantly older, controlling or intimidating
- Does this person promise to provide all basic human needs?
- Promises a way out for abused or runaway minors?
- Controls conversations, movements, interactions, money and ID
- Claims the minor is family, in a relationship or being cared for.
- Encourages minor to act older

Questions to ask if you have suspicions of trafficking:

- Do you know the person picking you up?
- Do you feel safe with the person you are traveling with?
- Do your parents/relatives know where you are? If not, why not?
- Are you free to come and go as you please?
- Are you or your family being threatened?
