The Report Cards on Child & Youth Sex Trafficking Advanced Legislative Framework builds on the original Protected Innocence Challenge Framework, preserving the most fundamental components while including new policy priorities that reflect feedback and research from the field—particularly in the area of victim protections. The advanced framework will be used to grade the states next fall when we release the inaugural Report Cards on Child & Youth Sex Trafficking. As such, the 2021 legislative session is a critical time for your state to strengthen its laws before report cards and corresponding grades are issued.

So what is **UTAH**'s current score and what changes are needed? As of August 1, 2019, **UTAH HAD RAISED ITS GRADE FROM F TO A:**

Utah criminalizes human trafficking of a child for sexual exploitation without regard to force, fraud, or coercion and has laws to prosecute demand for commercial sex acts with a

minor. State law prohibits the criminalization of minors for “prostitution” and “sexual solicitation.” Instead, law enforcement must refer commercially sexually exploited children to the Division of Child and Family Services for specialized services.
