The Report Cards on Child & Youth Sex Trafficking Advanced Legislative Framework builds on the original Protected Innocence Challenge Framework, preserving the most fundamental components while including new policy priorities that reflect feedback and research from the field—particularly in the area of victim protections. The advanced framework will be used to grade the states next fall when we release the inaugural Report Cards on Child & Youth Sex Trafficking. As such, the 2021 legislative session is a critical time for your state to strengthen its laws before report cards and corresponding grades are issued.

So what is **MICHIGAN**'s current score and what changes are needed? As of August 1, 2019, **MICHIGAN HAD RAISED ITS GRADE FROM F TO B:**

Michigan criminalizes sex trafficking of minors under age 18 without requiring force, fraud, or coercion, and buyers face penalties under both trafficking and

commercial sexual exploitation of children (CSEC) laws. A protective response allows juvenile sex trafficking victims to access specialized services through child welfare, but only minors under 16 years of age are completely protected from criminalization for prostitution offenses.
