The Report Cards on Child & Youth Sex Trafficking Advanced Legislative Framework builds on the original Protected Innocence Challenge Framework, preserving the most fundamental components while including new policy priorities that reflect feedback and research from the field—particularly in the area of victim protections. The advanced framework will be used to grade the states next fall when we release the inaugural Report Cards on Child & Youth Sex Trafficking. As such, the 2021 legislative session is a critical time for your state to strengthen its laws before report cards and corresponding grades are issued.

So what is **NEVADA’S** current score and what changes are needed? As of August 1, 2019, **NEVADA HAD RAISED ITS GRADE FROM F TO A:**

Nevada’s human trafficking law, “pandering and sex trafficking,” expressly includes sex trafficking of minors and does not require force, fraud, or coercion or

third party control. State law provides for a specialized service response and prohibits the criminalization of minors for prostitution and solicitation offenses; if the child is identified as a trafficking victim, the child will also be protected from criminalization from certain other offenses related to his or her victimization.
