Our Story

Shared Hope International strives to prevent the conditions that foster sex slavery, restore victims of sex trafficking, and bring justice to vulnerable adults and children. We lead prevention strategies, restoration programs, and justice initiatives to combat trafficking in the U.S. and abroad.

Linda Smith is a leader in the global movement to end sex trafficking around the world. Linda served as a Washington State legislator (1983-93) before she was elected to the U.S. Congress in 1994. Her compassionate and uncompromising belief that every indiviual has dignity has carried her from advocating for permanent safe homes for children in the State Senate to the halls of Congress, and ultimately to searching out victims in red light districts around the world.

Shared Hope combats sex trafficking through a three-pronged approach:

PREVENT

TRAINING Shared Hope offers annual training conferences, e-learning courses, webinars, and training guides to equip professionals and community members to identify signs of trafficking and respond to help sex trafficking victims.

ACTIVISM Hundreds of trained Ambassadors of Hope spread awareness about sex trafficking and teach communities to defend their children through online safety and awareness presentations.

- AMBASSADORS OF HOPE are people like you men and women who educate, equip, and connect with information and resources to wake up their communities to help prevent sex trafficking in America. They are an army of trained volunteers for Shared Hope, expanding our impact around the nation.
- THE DEFENDERS USA is a coalition of men who are opposed to all forms of commercialized sex, and who have taken a pledge to 1) Fight against any form of the sex industry, 2) Protect those around them, and 3) Hold other men accountable, with the goal to fight the demand side of domestic minor sex trafficking.

RESTORE

PARTNERS We provide funding and technical assistance to partners in India, Nepal, Jamaica, and the United States to offer safe homes, medical care, education, vocational training, therapy, and outreach and intervention services for survivors.

JUST RESPONSE COUNCIL We lead a group of over 30 organizations that collaborate on the best responses for juvenile sex trafficking victims based on the group's combined research and experience in services, law, and policy.

WOMEN'S INVESTMENT NETWORK Job training and leadership development programs help women compete in the global market and achieve financial independence. International programs include cosmetology, jewelry and leather making, and print services. The U.S. program focuses on computer and administrative skills.

BRING JUSTICE

We help strengthen trafficking laws and build better policies to protect victims by provicing comprehensive legal research, expert testimony, coalition support, and advocacy initiatives.

- THE PROTECTED INNOCENCE CHALLENGE Every state receives an annual Report Card that grades the strength of state laws in combating child sex trafficking and offers practical recommendations for improvement.
- THE STOP THE INJUSTICE CAMPAIGN seeks to send the criminalization of child sex trafficking victims and develop protective responsed to connect youth to trauma-informed services.







Shared Hope invests heavily in providing policy leaders, community advocates, and key stakeholders with data-driven comprehensive studies to create victim-centered and trauma-informed responses to child and youth sex trafficking.

- REPORT CARDS ON CHILD AND YOUTH SEX TRAFFICKING
 Six issue areas comprised of 40 issue briefs are utilized to grade every state's child sex trafficking legislation.
- VICTIM-OFFENDER INTERSECTIONALITY Provides insight on victim-offender intersectionality and appropriate responses.
- JuST RESPONSE COUNCIL Over 30 experts across the country collaborating to improve responses to child and youth sex trafficking through research, knowledge, and policy.

RESPOND: Treating Human Trafficking in the Field

This training resource offers a comprehensive understanding of domestic minor sex trafficking (DMST) and informed guidance on how service providers and first responders can play a role in identifying and responding to victims and survivors and aid in prevention. This course is



designed for any healthcare provider, social worker, counselor, or other service provider who may interact directly with survivors.

This resource covers the legal implications of VOI using case studies and expert field guidance to provide concrete recommendations for criminal justice stakeholders to make legal processes more victim centered and trauma informed.
